Subject: Murder of a Kaufman County Prosecutor Mark Hasse

Lieutenant,

It may not be a coincidence Mark was killed the next morning after I filed the affidavit we signed, and it may not be a coincidence Mark started receiving death-threats on the 24th of January, one day after I reported Bridger and Morton to Sgt. Straub of KSO by phone on 1/23/2013.

I met Mark 8/4/11. He gave me \$1 to make a phone call. Act of kindness. I still have his Kaufman County Criminal Prosecutor DA business card and I filed a case there for the underlying criminal activity on that date.

Fact in law: The killers were wearing body armor, not something easily obtained or usually used by gang members with their credo. Somebody who wears body armor does not want to die for now, in the moment. 2 Aryan Brothers of Texas who Mark was prosecuting plead guilty as soon as they heard Mark was killed. Bridger and Morton are prone to threats. Violence. Cover up. Cops don't do well in prison. My case in KSO CID is coveted. Prosecutor's home addresses and personal phone numbers are secrets. There are no leads as of now in Kaufman as far as anyone knows, after every effort has been made.

Supposing: You were an x-cop who knew you were going to prison for sure for felonies, dead-bang caught by your own police car accountability, CAD and 911 public records; false arrest of a citizen defending his property/life/business, a witness in filed financial abuse of an elder case, in his own home from a trespasser... And suppose you still had contacts in Crandall PD. And still had a prosecutor's contact information. And, suppose you were a prosecutor (Mark) who had no idea yet an Art. 2 case was coming your way, a case/complaint that Bridger and Morton knew could not preclude prosecutor's discretion.

If I was that criminal: I would first want to kill Mark, the ultimate informant, and see if I get away with it, shucking blame on the ABT, and colluding my case. If I got caught, not killed in the act, I would want to have a high place with the AB in jail, and other prison gangs for achieving the mark of killing a prosecutor. I would work the judicial system for all it is worth and live for a dozen years or more on appeals as a burden to society. That's if I did not get caught in the first place, and go free to maybe find me and kill me [KIM] and scuttle the whole thing.

This is a lead worth following. Motive. Opportunity. Evidence.

True or not about them, if you cops don't start fighting business crime/financial crime/corporate crime-on-crime-on-crime vis-à-vis, you will never have enough money to fight violent crime or protect yourselves, and the public. It is always about money. Fighting corporate crime is so easy because the evidence is always in public record. If that injures your UCR payments locally, well I just don't know what to say about that...
